



U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Veteran Assistance Program for Para-Equestrian Dressage Athletes

The VA supports military veterans in their efforts to represent the USA at International equestrian competitions. Veterans who demonstrate exceptional sport skills and the commitment necessary to pursue elite-level competition are given guidance on securing the training, support, and coaching needed to qualify for Team USA and achieve their Para-Equestrian (PE) dreams.

The VA Para-Equestrian Program helps to provide a monthly assistance allowance for disabled Veterans of the Armed Forces, as authorized by section 703 of the Veterans' Benefits Improvement Act of 2008.

Through the program, the VA will pay a monthly allowance to a Veteran with a service-connected or non-service-connected disability if the Veteran meets the minimum military standard or higher (i.e. Emerging, Talent Pool, National Team) in his/her respective sport at a recognized competition.

GENERAL PARA-EQUESTRIAN DRESSAGE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

In addition to meeting the military standard, athletes must:

- Be 17 years or older as of December 1, 2014.
- Be a U.S. citizen/Veteran.
- Must be a current member in good standing of USEF at the time that the Required Scores are achieved.
- Be medically eligible in accordance with the FEI Classification Manual for Para-Equestrian Competitions, 5th Edition, April 2017, Updated 24 July 2017 and Article 8422 of the FEI Rules for FEI Para-Equestrian Dressage Events to compete in Para-Equestrian dressage competitions. To do so, riders shall have either a national or international Para-Equestrian classification and be assigned a Grade. - Ride independently (without side aides).

REQUIRED SCORES:

Each Grade has its own series of FEI Tests - Novice Test, Team Test, Championship Test and Freestyle Test. The Official PE Tests are published by the FEI and can, in no case, be modified. FEI Para Dressage Tests may be found at <http://inside.fei.org/fei/your-role/organisers/p-e-dressage/tests>.

- A total of one score for each must be submitted as follows for the current competition year:
 - One "Championship Team" test score;
 - One "Individual" test score;
- The minimum score of any Team or Individual Championship test submitted must be 60% or higher;
- Scores may be submitted from any horse/rider combination;
- Scores shall be achieved at the Team or Individual Championship test of the rider's Grade level or at any test which is above the rider's Grade level.
 - Grade I Athletes compete at walk
 - Grade II Athletes compete at walk and trot
 - Grade III Athletes compete at walk and trot
 - Grade IV Athletes compete at walk, trot, with lateral work and canter
 - Grade V Athletes compete at walk, trot and canter with lateral work

All test scores (both rider and/or horse) must be achieved at USEF or FEI Para-Equestrian licensed competitions. FEI PE tests must be scored by a USEF "R" rated judge or above, or an FEI PE recognized judge.

Athletes are required to submit legible copies of all qualifying tests, clearly indicating the name of the judge and competition at which the scores were achieved to Laureen Johnson, USEF High Performance Director of Para-Equestrian Programs at the address below.
